

Modern Slavery Statement

(the “Company”) is a leading provider of mission critical water treatment solutions, offering services, systems and technologies to support its customers’ full water lifecycle needs. As a US-based company headquartered in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Evoqua operates 160 locations in eight countries and, with over 200,000 installations and 87 service branches, holds leading positions in the North American industrial, commercial and municipal water treatment markets, serving more than 38,000 customers worldwide.

The Company is committed to ensuring that human trafficking and forced labor do not form any part of our business activities. The Company is committed to identifying and taking concrete and effective steps to ensure that slavery and human trafficking are not taking place in any part of our supply chain or in any part of our business.

Prior to engaging in a supplier relationship, the Company requires suppliers and third party business partners to acknowledge and agree to abide by the Supplier Code of Conduct, which recognizes human rights of employees and prohibits the employment of child labor. If a supplier or third party business partner violates the Supplier Code of Conduct, the Company will take action, up to and including termination of the business relationship. The Company also performs appropriate due diligence on our third party business partners that includes database scans for negative information and regulatory/civil/criminal violations.

This statement is made pursuant to Section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our Modern Slavery statement for the financial year October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021.
